INTRODUCTION

When Ian Galloway's grandfather purchased his first Herefords in 1927 he couldn't have foreseen the massive and enduring contribution his stud would make to the Hereford breed in Australia.

Ninety years on, the current Cootharaba Hereford Stud principals Ian and Anne Galloway say the Cootharaba mission hasn't altered all that much.

"Our goals are simple and they are the same goals my grandfather and my parents strove for," Ian Galloway said.

"We aim to produce genetics that will improve growth rates and weight for age and still maintain the productive traits that enable our females to raise a calf each year in spite of tough seasonal conditions."

We're really proud to be celebrating ninety years and Anne and I will certainly be reflecting on the many years of hard work that have gone into Cootharaba when we host our on-property sale at Roma on the 6th of September.

HISTORIC COOTHARABA

A pioneer stud of the Hereford breed, Cootharaba has enjoyed a colorful history.

John James Galloway selected country in 1901 on the banks of Kin Kin Creek near Lake Cootharaba and started cutting the Red Cedar and Kauri Pine out of the rain forests and hauling the logs by bullock wagon to Lake Cootharaba from where they were barged to Sydney and Brisbane. He ran Shorthorn cattle on Cootharaba until 1915 when he introduced Herefords from the Reynolds family of Tocal who used to drive as many as 150 bulls north from Maitland NSW until they were all sold. John would ride his horse to Gympie to select his sires. He was so impressed with his Herefords that he purchased a line of stud females and a bull from the McConnell family of Cressbrook, Toogoolawah, and he registered the Cootharaba Hereford stud in 1927.

John James married Margaret Phillips and had three sons Jack (Ettiewyn, Hereford & Bradford, Goomeri), Allen (Cootharaba), Graham (Pinedale Poll Herefords) and one daughter Jess, a registered nurse. The three sons all cattlemen, developed their own studs.

Allen Galloway and his wife Ruby, carried on the Cootharaba Hereford herd at Pomana until 1953, when he moved to the Burnett District at Monto.

Allen and his wife Ruby had four sons and one daughter, all indoctrinated into the cattle business.

Graham and his wife Jill, Ascot Banana, Barry and Ainsley at Barrain, Blackwater, Ian and Anne Duarran Roma, Beverley and her husband Ralph Rea at Mirtna, Charters Towers, and Neville and Narelle who are still at Cootharaba, Monto.

In 1980, a third generation of Galloway cattleman took over the Cootharaba herd and Ian and Anne Galloway relocated many of the breeders to Duarran at Roma. The move out of the tick area proved to be a great step and the Cootharaba cattle thrived in the western conditions.

The first single vendor sale of the Cootharaba cattle took place at the Moura saleyards in 1970 and this year's sale at Duarran will mark the 48th annual on-property Cootharaba sale.
